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## **Pretty Pilgrim** Crochet Scarf

Get ready for your fall feast with this Pretty Pilgrim Scarf. This crochet scarf is a blend of traditional crochet and hip street style. It's warm enough to protect you from the cold and chic enough to wear through dinner. You'll love how versatile this scarf can be.



Skill Level

Size

Easy

18" [45.5 cm] x 52" [132 cm]

Gauge

8 sc and 9 rows = 4" 10 cm1

#### **Materials**

- Bernat Softee Chunky:
  - •#28021 Linen (1 skein)
- Size U.S. L/11 (8 mm) crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge

#### **Pattern**

Beg at bottom point, ch 4.

Row 1 (RS): 2 dc in 4th ch from hook (counts as 3 dc). Turn.

Row 2: Ch 5 (counts as dc and ch 2 here and throughout). 1 sc in center dc. Ch 2. 1 dc in top of ch 3. Turn.

Row 3: Ch 3 (counts as dc here and throughout), 2 dc in first dc. 1 sc in next ch-2 sp. 3 dc in next sc. 1 sc in next ch-2 sp. 3 dc in 3rd ch of ch 5. Turn.



Row 4: Ch 5. (1 sc in center dc of next 3 dc. Ch 3) twice. 1 sc in center dc of next 3 dc. Ch 2. 1 dc in top of ch 3. Turn.

Row 5: Ch 3. 2 dc in first dc. 1 sc in next ch-2 sp. (3 dc in next sc. 1 sc in next ch-3 sp) twice. 3 dc in next sc. 1 sc in next ch-2 sp. 3 dc in 3rd ch of ch 5. Turn.

**Row 6:** Ch 5. \*1 sc in center dc of next 3 dc. Ch 3. Rep from \* to last group of 3 dc. 1 sc in center dc of last 3 dc. Ch 2. 1 dc in top of ch 3. Turn.

Row 7: Ch 3. 2 dc in first dc. 1 sc in next ch-2 sp. \*3 dc in next sc. 1 sc in next ch-3 sp. Rep from \* to last sc. 3 dc in last sc. 1 sc in next ch-2 sp. 3 dc in 3rd ch of ch 5. Turn.

Rep 6th and 7th rows 9 times more. 43 groups of 3 dc. Do not turn or fasten off.

#### **Edging:**

Working along left side edge of Scarf down to point, ch 3. \*1 sc in side of dc or turning ch at end of next row. Ch 3.

Rep from \* to point. (1 sc. Ch 3. 1 sc) in point. Working up right side edge of Scarf, \*\*Ch 3. 1 sc in side of dc or turning ch at end of next row. Rep from \*\* to last row.

Fasten off. Leave top edge of Scarf free.



## **Cranberry Sauce** Shrug

Dressing for Thanksgiving dinner can be tricky; you want to look nice but not too fancy. That's where the Cranberry Sauce Shrug comes to the rescue: it's gorgeous, but comfortable, and perfect for wrapping around you when you're exhausted from stuffing yourself with the Thanksgiving feast.



#### Skill Level

Easy

#### Size

XS-M (L/XL, 2X-5XL) to fit bust 28-38 (40-46, 28-54)"

#### Gauge

12 sc x 13 rows = 4'' [10]cm]; 2 shells x 6 rows =4" [10 cm]

#### **Materials**

- Caron United:
  - #06009 Burgundy (3 (4, 5) skeins)
- Size U.S. I/9 (5.5 mm) crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge

#### **Pattern**

#### Left Side:

Beg at center of back, ch 56 (62, 74)

**Foundation row: (RS)** 1 sc in 2nd ch from hook. \*Miss next 2 ch. [(1 dc. Ch 2) twice. 1 dc] all in next ch - shell made. Miss next 2 ch. 1 sc in next ch. Rep from \* to end of chain. 9 (10, 12) Shells.

\*\*\*Row 1: Ch 5 (counts as dc and ch 2). 1 dc in first sc. \*Miss next dc and ch-2 sp. 1 sc in top of next Shell. Miss next ch-2 sp and dc. Shell in next sc. Rep from \* to last Shell. Miss next dc and ch-2 sp. 1 sc in top of next Shell. (1 dc. Ch 2. 1 tr) all in last sc. Turn.



Row 2: Ch 1. 1 sc in first tr. \*Shell in next sc. Miss next dc and ch-2 sp. 1 sc in top of next Shell. Miss next dc and ch-2 sp. Rep from \* to last sc. Shell in next sc. 1 sc in 2nd ch of turning ch 5. Turn. Last 2 rows form Shell Pat. Rep last 2 rows for pat until work from beg measures approx 9 (11, 13)" [23 (28, 33) cm], ending on a 1st row of pat.

#### **Shape Left Armhole:**

\*\*Row 1: Ch 1. 1 sc in first tr. (Shell in next sc. Miss next dc and ch-2 sp. 1 sc in top of next Shell) twice. Ch 23 (29, 35). Miss next 3 (4, 5) Shells. 1 sc in top of next Shell. Miss next dc and ch-2 sp. \*Shell in next sc. Miss next dc and ch-2 sp. 1 sc in next dc (top of Shell). Miss next dc and ch-2 sp. Rep from \* to last sc. Shell in next sc. 1 sc in 2nd ch of turning ch 5. Turn.

Row 2: Ch 5 (counts as dc and ch 2). 1 dc in first sc. (Miss next dc and ch-2 sp. 1 sc in top of next Shell. Miss next ch-2 sp and dc. Shell in next sc) 3 (3, 5) times. (Miss next 2 ch. 1 sc in next ch. Miss next 2 ch. Shell in next ch) 3 (4, 5) times. Miss next 2 ch. 1 sc in next ch. Miss next 2 ch. Shell in next sc. \*Miss next dc and ch-2 sp. 1 sc in top of next Shell. Miss next ch-2 sp and dc. Shell in next sc. Rep from \* to last Shell. Miss next dc and ch-2 sp. 1 sc in top of next Shell. (1 dc. Ch 2. 1 tr) all in last sc. Turn.

Cont in pat even until work from armhole measures 11 (14-, 17)" [28 (35.5, 43) cm], \*\*\* ending on a WS row. Fasten off.

#### Right Side:

Cont in pat even until work from armhole measures 11 (14, 17)" [28 (35.5, 43) cm], \*\*\* ending on a WS row. Fasten off.

Row 1: 1 sc in same sp as sl st. \*Miss next 2 ch. Shell in next ch. Miss next 2 ch. 1 sc in next ch. Rep from \* to end of chain. 9 (10, 12) Shells

Work from \*\*\* to \*\*\* as given for Left Side, ending on a RS row. Fasten off.



## Stylish Fall Fingerless Gloves

In less than two hours you can work up these Stylish Fall Fingerless Gloves. The crochet design is worked up beautifully using the extended single crochet stitch. Wear a fashionable glove like this in a cold office or outdoors during a crisp autumn day.



Skill Level

Easy

Size

 $3.5" \times 7.5"$ 

Gauge

In back loops, 16 sc =4" [10 cm]

#### **Materials**

- Any worsted weight yarn:
  - Your choice of color (1 skein)
- Size U.S. G/6 (4.25 mm) hook
- Two 3/4" wooden buttons

#### **Pattern**

With G hook, ch 12.

**Row 1**: 1 sc in 2nd chain from hook and each chain across. Turn. 11 sc.

Row 2: Working in back loops only, ch 1 (not counted as a st), 1 sc in back loop of the same st as ch 1, 1 sc in back loop of next 10 stitches. Turn. 11 sc.

Repeat Row 2 till your work measures 7 inches. Do not stretch your band while measuring. Slip stitch the two shorter ends together inserting your hook through the front loops of the stitches on your last row and the free loops on the very first row to form a circular band. I got 14 ridges in the band inc the ridge formed by slip stitching the ends together. Cont working in the round.

**Rnd 1**: Ch 1 (does not count as a st), proceed to work a round of sc all around the band, making 1 sc in each sc row end (one in each ridge and trough). SI st to the first sc. Do not turn, 28 sc.



**Rnd 2**: Ch 3 (counts as first esc and ch 1), skip 1 st, \*(1 esc in next st, ch 1, skip 1 st), repeat from \* till end of the round. You would have reached the beginning ch 3, do not turn. 14 esc in the round.

**Note**: Esc is the stitch right before it to the right and not the one on top of it.

Rnd 3: Work 1 esc in to top of beginning chain 2 of previous round, place a marker in the esc you just made. The marker will show you where Round 3 started. \*(1 esc in next esc, ch 1, sk 1 st), repeat from \* till you reach back near the marked st. Do not turn. 14 esc.

**Rnd 4**: 1 esc in marked st, move the marker up in to the esc you just made, ch 1, sk 1 st, \*(1 esc in next esc, ch 1, sk 1 st), repeat from \* till you reach back near the marked st. Do not turn. 14 esc.

Repeat Round 4 four more times. Every time you reach back near the marked stitch you would have completed one round.

#### For Left Mitten Only:

**Next Rnd (Rnd 9):** 1 esc in marked st, move the marker up in to the esc you just made, ch 1, sk 1 st, \*(1 esc in next esc, ch 1, sk 1 st), repeat from \* 2 times, 1 esc in next esc, chain 3 loosely, skip a total of 3 stitches, \*(1 esc in next esc, ch 1, sk 1 st), repeat from \* till you reach back near the marked st. Do not turn. 13 esc.

**Note**: The skipped stitches will form the hole for your thumb.

#### For Right Mitten Only:

Next Rnd (Rnd 9): 1 esc in marked st, move the marker up in to the esc you just made, ch 1, sk 1 st, \*(1 esc in next esc, ch 1, sk 1 st), repeat from \* 8 times, 1 esc in next esc, chain 3 loosely, skip a total of 3 stitches, \*(1 esc in next esc, ch 1, sk 1 st), repeat from \* till you reach back near the marked st. Do not turn. 13 esc The skipped stitches will form the hole for your thumb.



#### Continue for Right and Left Mittens:

**Rnd 10**: 1 esc in marked st, move the marker up in to the esc you just made, ch 1, sk 1 st, \*(1 esc in next esc, ch 1, sk 1 st), repeat from \* till you reach the chain 3 of previous round, work 1 esc in to the ch-3 space, ch 1, 1 esc in next esc, ch 1, sk 1 st), repeat from \* till you reach back near the marked st. Do not turn. 14 esc.

Rnds 11 & 12: 1 esc in marked st, move the marker up in to the esc you just made, ch 1, sk 1 st, \*(1 esc in next esc, ch 1, sk 1 st), repeat from \* till you reach back near the marked st. Do not turn. 14 esc.

**Rnd 13**: 1 regular sc in the marked esc, sl st to the next ch 1. This would have evened out the edges. Ch 1, 1 sc in next st and each st across, sl st to beginning ch 1. Fasten off.

#### Finishing:

Weave in any tails left and sew two wooden buttons on to the ribbed band for embellishment.





## **Pumpkin Spice Pie**

This adorable Pumpkin Spice Pie is the perfect crochet pattern to make for Thanksgiving. Not only is it cute and easy to work up, it's totally devoid of calories! As a bonus, tucked inside is a sachet filled with pumpkin pie spice, so it smells yummy, too! Make your kitchen and dining room smell delicious this fall.



**Skill Level** 

Easy

Size

18" [45.5 cm] x 52" [132 cm]

Gauge

None listed

#### **Materials**

- Worsted weight yarn:
  - Gray, burnt orange, tan, white
- Size U.S. E/4 (3.5 mm) crochet hook
- Black safety eyes (10 mm)
- Polyester stuffing
- Yarn needle

- 23/4" plastic canvas circle (or cardboard)
- Embroidery needle
- Black embroidery floss
- Scrap of fabric
- Thread
- Pumpkin pie spice

#### **Pattern**

#### Pan:

**Rnd 1:** With gray yarn, make an adjustable ring, ch 1, and sc 6 into ring. Pull closed. (6)

**Rnd 2:** 2 Sc into each st. (12)

Rnd 3: (2 Sc into next st, sc into next st)\* rep to end of rnd. (18)

Rnd 4: (2 Sc into next st, sc into next 2 st)\* rep to end of rnd. (24)



- **Rnd 5**: (2 Sc into next st, sc into next 3 st)\* rep to end of rnd. (30)
- Rnd 6: Working into BLO of each st, (2 Sc into next st, sc into next 9 st)\* rep to end of rnd. (33)
- **Rnd 7**: Working into both loops of each st, sc into each st, inc 1. (34)
- **Rnd 8:** Sc into each st, inc 1. (35)
- **Rnd 9**: Sc into each st, inc 1. (36)

Fasten off. Leave tail very long for assembly later.

#### Top of Pie:

- **Rnd 1**: With orange yarn, make an adjustable ring, ch 1, and sc 6 into ring. Pull closed. (6)
- **Rnd 2**: 2 Sc into each st. (12)
- **Rnd 3**: (2 Sc into next st, sc into next st)\* rep to end of rnd. (18)
- Rnd 4: (2 Sc into next st, sc into next 2 st)\* rep to end of rnd. (24)
- Rnd 5: (2 Sc into next st, sc into next 3 st)\* rep to end of rnd. (30)
- Rnd 6: (2 Sc into next st, sc into next 4 st)\* rep to end of rnd. (36)

Change color to tan at the last stitch of Rnd 6.

- **Rnd 7:** Working into FLO (front loops only) of each st, sc into each st around. (36)
- Rnd 8: Working into both loops of each st, (6 hdc into next st, sl st into next 2 sts)\* repeat to end of round.

Fasten off and leave a long tail for sewing.

#### **Whipped Cream:**

**Row 1**: With white yarn, ch 7, leaving a long (10") beginning tail. Working into BLO, work 2 sc into the 2nd ch from the hook, sc into the next 3 ch, sc2tog. (6)



Continue in BLO.

Row 2: Ch 1, turn. Sc2tog, sc into next 3 st, 2 sc into last st. (6)

**Row 3**: Ch 1, turn. 2 Sc into first st, sc into next 3 st, sc2tog. (6)

Rows 4-9: Alternate Rows 2 and 3.

**Row 10:** Ch 1, turn. Line up Row 10 and Row 1. It will be on a diagonal. SI st the rows together. You will form a tube.

Fasten off and leave a long (18") tail. Thread the tail onto a yarn needle and weave the tail through the row ends at the top of the tube you've just created. Pull the tail tightly to close up the top of the tube. Insert your hook into a nearby stitch and pull up a loop of the tail. Ch 3, then sc into 2nd ch from hook and next ch. SI st back into where you started. This has created the "peak" of the whipped cream. Fasten off and weave in the ends. Use the beginning yarn tail to sew the whipped cream to the top of the pie in the center. Stuff sparingly as you go.

#### Sachet:

Create a tiny sachet to make your pie smell sweet! Fold the rectangular scrap of fabric in half and seam two edges either by hand or machine sewing. Fill the sachet with pumpkin pie spice (I used almost a teaspoon) and stitch closed.

#### Assembly:

Insert the safety eyes into the top of the pie as shown. Embroider mouth using two loose straight stitches in a "v" shape.

Insert the plastic canvas (or cardboard) circle into the bottom of the pie.

Place the Top of the Pie onto the Pan and stitch into place using the Pan's gray yarn tail, stitching into the unused back loops of Rnd 7 of the Top of the Pie. Before you close it up, stuff with polyester fiberfil and insert the sachet. Continue stitching and fasten off, hiding yarn tail inside pie.



## Fabulous Fall Table Runner

This Fabulous Fall Table Runner adds an elegant and festive touch to your table. The fall leaves are crocheted separately, so you can make as many as you want in as many different colors as you want. This fall table runner looks great sitting under a bowl of fresh fall fruit.



#### Skill Level

Easy

#### Size

14" [35.5 cm] x 39" [99 cm]

#### Gauge

14 dc and 8 rows = 4" [10 cm]

#### **Materials**

- Red Heart with Love:
  - #401 Pewter (A, 1 skein)
  - #1201 Daffodil (B, 1 skein)
  - #1909 Holly Berry (C, 1 skein)
  - #1252 Mango (D, 1 skein)
  - #1530 Violet (E, 1 skein)

- Size U.S. L/11 (8 mm) crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Size U.S. H/8 (5 mm) crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Yarn needle

#### **Pattern**

#### First Side:

With A, ch 51.

Row 1 (RS): Dc in 4th ch from hook (beginning ch count as first dc) and in each ch across, turn. 49 dc.

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first dc, \*ch 2, skip next 2 dc, dc in next dc, ch 2, skip next 2 dc, sc in next dc; repeat from \* across ending with last sc in 3rd ch of beginning ch, turn. 9 sc, 8 dc, and 16 ch-2 spaces.



**Row 3:** Ch 3 (counts as first dc here and throughout), 2 dc in first sc, sc in next dc, \*5 dc in next sc, sc in next dc; repeat from \* to last sc, 3 dc in last sc, turn. 8 sc and 41 dc.

Row 4: Repeat Row 2.

**Row 5:** Ch 3, 2 dc in first ch-2 space, dc in next dc, 2 dc in next ch-2 space, dc in next sc, \*2 dc in next ch-2 space, dc in next dc, 2 dc in next ch-2 space, dc in next sc; repeat from \* across, turn. 49 dc.

Row 6: Repeat Row 2.

Rows 7–30: Repeat Rows 3–6 six times.

Rows 31 and 32: Repeat Rows 3 and 4.

Row 33: Ch 1, slip st in first sc, slip st in first ch-2 space, slip st in next dc, slip st in next ch-2 space, slip st in next sc, ch 3, \*2 dc in next ch-2 space, dc in next dc, 2 dc in next ch-2 space, dc in next sc; repeat from \* 5 times; leave remaining sts and spaces unworked, turn. 37 dc.

Row 34: Repeat Row 6.

**Rows 35 and 36**: Repeat Rows 3 and 4. 7 sc, 6 dc, and 12 ch-2 spaces.

Row 37: Ch 1, slip st in first sc, slip st in first ch-2 space, slip st in next dc, slip st in next ch-2 space, slip st in next sc, ch 3, \*2 dc in next ch-2 space, dc in next dc, 2 dc in next ch-2 space, dc in next sc; repeat from \* 4 times; leave remaining sts and spaces unworked, turn. 25 dc.

**Rows 38 and 39**: Repeat Rows 2 and 3. 6 sc and 26 dc.

Fasten off.

#### 2nd Side:

**Row 1 (RS):** With right side facing and working in opposite side of foundation ch, join A with slip st in first ch, ch 3, dc in each ch across, turn. 49 dc.

Rows 2-39: Repeat Rows 2-39 of first side.



#### Leaf:

(Make 16—4 each with B, C, D, and E)

Ch 7.

**Row 1 (RS):** Slip st in 2nd ch from hook and in next 4 ch (stem made), (slip st, 5 sc, slip st) in last ch, turn. 5 sc.

**Row 2:** Ch 1, skip first slip st, 2 sc in first 2 sc, 3 sc in next sc, 2 sc in last 2 sc, turn. 11 SC.

**Row 3:** Ch 4, slip st in 2nd ch from hook, hdc in next ch, dc in next ch, skip first sc, sc in next sc (point made); \*ch 4, slip st in 2nd ch from hook, hdc in next ch, dc in next ch, skip first sc, sc in next sc\* (point made), ch 5, slip st in 2nd ch from hook, hdc next ch, dc in last 2 ch, skip next 2 sc, sc in next sc (point made); repeat from \* to \* twice. 5 points. Do not turn.

**Note**: Do not worked around stem. When instructed to hold stem away from work, hold it towards you so chain is under stem on wrong side.

Rnd 4 (RS): Working in ends of rows, sc in first 2 rows, holding stem away from work, ch 1, skip next row (stem), sc in next 2 rows, \*working in opposite side of foundation ch of next point, sc in each ch to next ch-1 space, (sc, ch 1, sc) in next ch-1 space, sc in each hdc and dc\*\*, skip first foundation ch of next point; repeat from \* 4 times, ending last repeat at \*\*; join in first sc. Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.

#### Finishing:

Using photograph as a guide, with A, embroider veins on leaves with straight stitches and long back stitches. Arrange leaves as desired and sew in place. Weave in ends.



## **Happy Hour** Wine Charms

By: Lion Brand Yarns

Keep your cocktails organized this autumn with Happy Hour Wine Charms. Work up these insanely cute crocheted maple leaves in different colors to keep track of everyone's drinks at your next dinner party. This quick and easy crochet pattern also makes a great homemade hostess gift idea.



#### Skill Level

#### Easy

#### Size

Maple leaf is approx. 2" [5 Not necessary cm]

#### **Materials**

- Vanna's Choice Yarn:
  - #135 Rust (A)
  - #133 Brick (B)
  - #158 Mustard (C)
  - #174 Olive (D)

• Size U.S. G/6 (4 mm) crochet hook

Gauge

 Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6)

#### **Pattern**

#### **Maple Leaves:**

Make one each of A, B, C and D.

Ch 4.

**Row 1:** 2 sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next ch, 2 sc in last ch. 5 sc. Ch 1, turn.

Row 2: 2 sc in sc, sc in 3 sc, 2 sc in last sc. 7 sc. Ch 1, turn.



Rows 3-5: Sc in sc across. 7 sc.

Ch 2, turn.

Row 6: Hdc in sc, sl st in next sc, sc in sc, hdc in sc, sc in sc, sl st in sc, hdc in sc. Ch 2, turn.

Row 7: Hdc in hdc, sl st in sl st, sc in sc, (dc, ch 2, dc) in next st, sc in sc, sl st in sl st, hdc in hdc.

Fasten off.

#### **Aspen Leaves:**

Make one each of A, B, C, and D.

Ch 3.

**Row 1:** 2 sc in 2nd and third ch from hook, 4 sc.

Ch 1, turn.

**Row 2**: 2 sc in sc, sc in 2 sc, 2 sc in sc. 6 sc.

Ch 1, turn.

Rows 3-6: Sc in sc across. 6 sc.

Ch 1, turn.

**Row 7:** Sc2tog, sc in 2 sc, sc2tog. 4 sc.

Ch 1, turn.

Row 8: Sc2tog twice. 2 sc.

Ch 1, turn.

Row 9: Sc2tog. Fasten off.

#### Finishing:

Embroider straight st veins on leaves. Arrange leaves alternating shapes and colors, sew together. With a scrap of D, make side ties on first and last leaves approximately 6 inches (15 cm) long. Weave in ends.



## Maple Leaf Fall **Crochet Decor**

Decorate your living room or dining area with a few of these Maple Leaf Fall Crochet Décor banner decorations and you're all set for the holidays. Your guests will notice how much time you put into your homemade decor that matches the season and holiday perfectly.



#### Skill Level

Intermediate

#### Size

70" [178 cm] long; Maple Working in the back leaf = 7" [18 cm] x6.5" [16.5 cm]

#### Gauge

loops, 16 sc x 17 rows =4" [10 cm]

#### **Materials**

- Red Heart Super Saver:
  - #319 Cherry Red (A, 1 skein)
  - #316 Soft White (B, 1 skein)

- Size U.S. H/8 (5 mm) and J/10 (6 mm) crochet hooks
- Yarn Needle

#### **Pattern**

Note: All stitches are worked in the back loops unless otherwise specified Maple Leaf (Make 7):

#### **Leaf Center:**

With US H/8 hook and A, ch 13.

**Row 1: (RS)** Turn the foundation chain over and work into the back bar of each ch. Sc in the 2nd ch from hook and next 11 ch, ch 2, do not turn; working into the opposite side of the foundation chain and inserting the hook into the top two loops of each ch, sc in next 10 ch, ch 1; turn. 12 sc, one ch-2 space, 10 sc.



**Row 2**: Sc in next 10 sc, (sc, ch 2, sc) in ch-2 space, sc in next 10 sc, ch 1; turn. 11 sc, one ch-2 space, 11 sc.

Row 3: Sc in next 11 sc, (sc, ch 2, sc) in ch-2 space, sc in next 8 sc, ch 1; turn. 12 sc, one ch-2 space, 9 sc.

**Row 4**: Sc in next 9 sc, (sc, ch 3, sc) in ch-2 space, sc in next 9 sc, ch 1; turn. 10 sc, one ch-3 space, 10 sc.

#### Left Half:

**Row 1:** Work into Row 4 of Leaf Center. Sc in next 5 sc, slip st in next sc, ch 1; turn. 5 sc, slip st.

**Row 2**: Sc in blo of slip st, sc in next 2 sc, ch 3; turn. 3 sc, ch-3.

**Row 3:** Skip first ch, sc in top loop only of next 2 ch, sc in next 3 sc, slip st in next sc (Leaf Center Row 4), ch 1; turn. 5 sc, slip st.

**Row 4:** Sc in blo of slip st, sc in next 5 sc, ch 3; turn. 6 sc, ch-3.

Row 5: Skip first ch, sc in top loop only of next 2 ch, sc in next 6 sc, slip st in next sc (Leaf Center Row 4), ch 1; turn. 8 sc, slip st.

**Row 6:** Sc in blo of slip st, sc in next 6 sc, ch 1; turn. 7 sc.

**Row 7**: Sc in next 7 sc, slip st in next sc (Leaf Center Row 4), ch 1; turn. 7 sc, slip st.

**Row 8**: Sc in blo of slip st, sc in next 4 sc, ch 3; turn. 5 sc, ch-3.

Row 9: Skip first ch, sc in top loop only of next 2 ch, sc in next 5 sc, slip st in next sc (Leaf Center Row 4), ch 1; turn. 7 sc, slip st.

**Row 10:** Sc in blo of slip st, sc in next 4 sc, ch 1; turn. 5 sc.

**Row 11**: Sc in next 5 sc, 2 sc in ch-3 space (Leaf Center Row 4); do not turn. 7 sc.



#### **Right Half:**

- **Row 1**: Work up RS of Leaf Center Row 4. Sc in next 7 sc, ch 3; turn. 7 sc, ch-3.
- **Row 2:** Skip first ch, sc in top loop only of next 2 ch, sc in next 3 sc, slip st in next sc (Right Half Row 1), ch 1; turn. 5 sc, slip st.
- **Row 3**: Sc in blo of slip st, sc in next 5 sc, ch 3; turn. 6 sc, ch-3.
- **Row 4**: Skip first ch, sc in top loop only of next 2 ch, sc in next 6 sc, slip st in next sc (Right Half Row 1), ch 1; turn. 8 sc, slip st.
- **Row 5**: Sc in blo of slip st, sc in next 6 sc, ch 1; turn. 7 sc.
- **Row 6**: Sc in next 7 sc, slip st in next sc (Right Half Row 1), ch 1; turn. 7 sc, slip st.
- **Row 7**: Sc in blo of slip st, sc in next 4 sc, ch 3; turn. 5 sc, ch-3.
- **Row 8**: Skip first ch, sc in top loop only of next 2 ch, sc in next 5 sc, slip st in next sc (Right Half Row 1), ch 1; turn. 7 sc, slip st.
- **Row 9**: Sc in blo of slip st, sc in next 4 sc, ch 1; turn. 5 sc.

#### **Bottom and Stem:**

- Row 1: Work across both sides of the Leaf. Sc in next 5 sc, slip st in blo of next 2 sc (Left Half Row 11), sc in next 3 sc, ch 1; turn. 5 sc, 2 slip sts, 3 sc.
- **Row 2**: Sc in next 3 sc, slip st in blo of next 2 slip sts, sc in next 3 sc, ch 1; turn. 3 sc, 2 slip sts, 3 sc.
- Row 3: Sc in next 3 sc, slip st in blo of next slip st, ch 10, skip 5 ch, slip st in back bar of next 5 ch, slip st in next slip st. Fasten off and weave in ends.

#### **Banner Chain:**

With 6 mm [US J-10] hook and B, ch 225. Fasten off and weave in ends.

#### **Materials**

- Caron Simply Soft:
  - #39768 Dark Chocolate (A, 2 balls)
  - #39703 Bone (B, 3 balls)
  - #39730 Autumn Red (C, 3 balls)
  - #39702 Off White (D, 2 balls)

• Size U.S. H/8 (5 mm) crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge

#### **Pattern**

#### Stripe Pattern:

4 rows A, 4 rows B, 6 rows C, 2 rows D, 2 rows C, 6 rows B, 4 rows A, 2 rows D.

#### Blanket:

**Note:** Ch 3 at beg of row counts as dc. With A, ch 258 (multiple of 32) loosely, placing markers on every 25th ch for easier count. (See diagram on next page)

**Set up row:** 1 dc in 4th ch from hook. 1 dc in each of next 12 ch. \*Skip next 4 ch. 1 dc in each of next 14 ch. Ch 3. 1 dc in each of next 14 ch. Rep from \* across to last 18 ch. Skip next 4 ch. 1 dc in each of last 14 ch. Turn.




Row 1: Ch 3. 1 dc in first st. 2 dc in next st. (Skip next st. Ch 1. 1 dc in next st) 5 times. \*Skip next 4 sts. (1 dc in next st. Skip next st. Ch 1) 5 times. 2 dc in next st.\*\* Skip next st. (2 dc. Ch 3. 2 dc) in next ch-3 sp. Skip next st. 2 dc in next st. (Skip next st. Ch 1. 1 dc in next st) 5 times. Rep from \* across, ending last rep at \*\*. 2 dc in turning ch. Turn.

Row 2: Ch 1. 2 sc in first st. 2 sc in next st. 1 sc in each of next 10 sts (ie. dc or ch-1 sp). \*Skip next 4 sts. 1 sc in each of next 10 sts. 2 sc in next st.\*\* Skip next st. (2 sc. Ch 3. 2 sc) in next ch-3 sp. Skip next st. 2 sc in next st. 1 sc in each of next 10 sts. Rep from \* across, ending last rep at \*\*. 2 sc in turning ch. Turn.

Row 3: Ch 3. 1 dc in first st. 2 dc in next st. 1 dc in each of next 10 sts. \*Skip next 4 sts. 1 dc in each of next 10 sts.\*\* 2 dc in next st. Skip next st. (2 dc. Ch 3. 2 dc) in next ch-3 sp. Skip next st. 2 dc in next st. 1 dc in each of next 10 sts. Rep from \*across, ending last rep at \*\*. 2 dc in each of last 2 sts. Join B. Turn.

**Row 4**: With B, ch 3. 1 dc in first st. 2 dc in next st. (Skip next st. Ch 1. Puff in next st) 5 times. \*Skip next 4 sts. (Puff in next st. Skip next st. Ch 1) 5 times. 2 dc in next st. Skip next st.\*\* (2 dc. Ch 3. 2 dc) in next ch-3 sp. Skip next st. 2 dc in next st. (Skip next st. Ch 1. Puff in next st) 5 times. Rep from \* across, ending last rep at \*\*. 2 dc in turning ch. Turn.

Row 5: Ch 3. 1 dc in first st. 2 dc in next st. 1 dc in each of next 10 sts. \*Skip next 4 sts. 1 dc in each of next 10 sts.\*\* 2 dc in next st. Skip next st. (2 dc. Ch 3. 2 dc) in next ch-3 sp. Skip next st. 2 dc in next st. 1 dc in each of next 10 sts. Rep from \* across, ending last rep at \*\*. 2 dc in each of last 2 sts. Turn. First 6 rows of Stripe Pat are now in position. Keeping cont of Stripe Pat, rep 1st to 5th rows for Chevron Pat until Blanket from beg measures 60" [152.5 cm]. Fasten off.

#### Size

18" [42.5 cm] in diameter

#### Gauge

 $13 \, dc \, x \, 6 \, rows = 4'' \, [10]$ cml

#### **Materials**

- Lily Sugar 'n Cream:
  - #1130 Warm Brown (MC, 1 skein)
  - #2013 Terra Firma (A, 1 skein)
  - #1612 Country Yellow (B, 1 skein)
- Size U.S. H/8 (5 mm) crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Small amount of black yarn for eye embroidery

#### **Pattern**

#### **Body:**

\*\*With MC, ch 4. Join with sl st to form ring.

**Note:** Ch 3 at beg of rnd or row counts as dc.

Rnd 1: Ch 3. 11 dc in ring. Join with sl st to top of ch-3. 12 dc.

Rnd 2: Ch 3. 1 dc in same sp as last sl st. 2 dc in each dc around. Join with sl st to top of ch-3. 24 dc.

Rnd 3: Ch 3. 1 dc in same sp as last sl st. 1 dc in next dc. \*2 dc in next dc. 1 dc in next dc. Rep from \* around. Join with sl st to top of ch-3. 36 dc.



Rnd 4: Ch 3. 1 dc in same sp as last sl st. 1 dc in each of next 2 dc. \*2 dc in next dc. 1 dc in each of next 2 dc. Rep from \* around. Join with sl st to top of ch-3. 48 dc.

Rnd 5: Ch 3. 1 dc in same sp as last sl st. 1 dc in each of next 3 dc. \*2 dc in next dc. 1 dc in each of next 3 dc. Rep from \* around. Join with sl st to top of ch-3. 60 dc.

Cont as established, inc 12 dc each rnd to 108 dc. Join A with sl st to top of ch-3 at end of last rnd. Beg working in rows.

Row 1: With A, ch 3. 1 dc in same sp as last sl st. \*1 dc in each of next 8 dc. 2 dc in next dc. Rep from \* 6 times more. Turn. 72 dc. Leave rem sts unworked.

Row 2: Ch 3. 1 dc in first dc. \*1 dc in each of next 9 dc. 2 dc in next dc. Rep from \* to last dc. 1 dc in last dc. Turn. 80 dc.

Row 3: Ch 4 (counts as tr). \*1 tr in each of next 3 dc. Ch 3. Rep from \* to last 4 dc. 1 tr in each of last 4 dc. Turn.

Row 4: Ch 1. Miss first tr. 1 sc in each of next 3 tr. \*(3 dc. Ch 4. SI st in first ch - picot made. 3 dc) in next ch-3 sp. Miss next tr. 1 sc in next tr. Miss next tr. Rep from \*, ending with 1 sc in top of ch-4. Fasten off.

#### Beak:

With B, ch 14.

**Row 1**: 1 sc in 2nd ch from hook, 1 sc in each ch across, Turn, 13 sc.

**Row 2**: Ch 1. Draw up a loop in each of next 2 sc. Yoh and draw through all loops on hook – sc2tog made. 1 sc in each sc to last 2 sc. Sc2tog. Turn. 11 sts.

Row 3: Ch 1. Sc2tog. 1 sc in each sc to last 2 sts. Sc2tog. Turn. Rep last row 3 times more. 3 sts.

**Next row**: Ch 1. Draw up a loop in each of next 3 sts. Yoh and draw through all loops on hook – sc3tog made. Fasten off.



#### Feet (make 2):

With B, ch 2.


Row 1: 8 sc in 2nd ch from hook. Join with sl st to first sc

**Row 2**: Ch 5. SI st in 2nd ch from hook and each of next 3 ch. (1 sc in next sc. Ch 7. SI st in 2nd ch from hook and each of next 5 ch) twice. 1 sc in next sc. Ch 5. SI st in 2nd ch from hook and each of next 3 ch. SI st in next sc. Fasten off.

Sew Feet and Beak in position (see picture).

With black yarn, embroider eyes using Satin St.

## **Thanksgiving Leaves Wreath**

Thanksgiving can be the hardest holiday to decorate for, but this Thanksgiving Leaves Wreath is perfect for your home decor this year. Welcome guests into your home by hanging this wreath full of leaves on your front door as a festive homemade decoration.



#### Skill Level

Easy

#### Size

12" wreath

#### Gauge

5 sc x 4 rows = 1'' [2.5]cml

#### **Materials**

- Red Heart Super Saver:
  - #256 Carrot (A, 1 skein)
  - #624 Tea Leaf (B, 1 skein)
  - #254 Pumpkin (C, 1 skein)
  - #320 Cornmeal (D, 1 skein)
  - #365 Coffee (E, 1 skein)
  - #947 Marrakesh (F, 1 skein)
  - #321 Gold (G, 1 skein)
  - #336 Warm Brown (H, 1 skein)

#### **Pattern**

Carefully wrap wreath with F. Set aside.

- Size U.S. G/6 (4 mm) crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- 12" (30.5 cm) straw wreath
- Stuffing
- Glue gun



#### Oak Leaf (make 1 B and 2 G):

Ch 15.

**Rnd 1**: Slip st in 2nd ch from hook and in next 3 chs for stem, [ch 4, hdc in 2nd ch, dc in next 2 chs, sc in next 3 chs of original ch] 3 times, 5 dc in last ch, working on opposite side of original ch, sc in next 3 chs, repeat between [] twice, ch 4, hdc in 2nd ch, dc in next 2 chs, sc in next ch on original ch, do not join.

Rnd 2: Working behind stem, sc in each sc around Leaf, working 2 sc in each top curve, join with slip st in first sc. Fasten off.

#### Maple Leaf (make 1 each A, B, C and D):

Ch 7.

**Row 1**: Slip st in 2nd ch from hook and in next 4 chs, 5 sc in last ch, ch 1, turn.

Row 2: 2 sc in each sc across, ch 1, turn. 10 sc.

Row 3: 2 sc in first 2 sc, sc in next 6 sc, 2 sc in last 2 sc, ch 1, turn. 14 sc.

Rows 4-6: Sc in each sc across, ch 1, turn.

**Row 7:** Sc2tog in 2 sc, sc across to last 2 sc, sc2tog in last 2 sc, ch 1, turn. 12 sc.

#### **First Point:**

Row 8: Sc2tog in next 2 sc, sc in next 2 sc, ch 1, turn. 3 sc.

Row 9: Sc in next 3 sc, ch 1, turn.

**Row 10**: Sc2tog in next 2 sc, sc in last sc, ch 1, turn. 2 sc.

Row 11: Sc in next 2 sc, ch 1, turn.

**Row 12**: Sc2tog in next 2 sc. Fasten off.

#### **Center Point:**

**Row 8**: Join with sc in next unworked sc on row 7, sc in next 3 sc, ch 1, turn. 4 sc.

Rows 9 & 10: Sc in each sc across, ch 1, turn.

**Row 11**: [Sc2tog in next 2 sc] twice, ch 1, turn. 2 sc.

Row 12: Sc in each sc across, ch 1, turn.

**Row 13**: Sc2tog in 2 sc. Fasten off.



#### **Last Point:**

**Row 8**: Join with sc in next unworked sc on row 7, sc in next sc, sc2tog in last 2 sc, ch 1, turn. 3 sc.

Row 9: Sc in each sc across, ch 1, turn.

Row 10: Sc in next sc, sc2tog in next 2 sc, ch 1, turn. 2 sc.

**Row 11**: Sc in each sc across, ch 1, turn.

#### **Edging:**

Sc in each sc around Leaf, working 3 sc in each point and working behind stem, join with slip st in first sc. Fasten off.

#### Acorn (make 4):

#### Top:

With E, ch 5.

**Rnd 1**: Slip st in 2nd ch from hook and next 2 chs, 6 sc in last ch.

**Rnd 2**: Now working in rounds, [2 sc in first sc, sc in next sc] around, join in first sc. Leaving long end, fasten off. 9 sc.

#### **Bottom:**

With H, ch 2.

**Rnd 1**: 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook, do not join.

**Rnd 2**: [Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. 9 sc.

Rnds 3-5: Sc in each sc around. Leaving long end, fasten off. Stuff. Using long end, draw remaining sts together.

#### **Acorn Assembly:**

Using long end from Top, sew Top in place.



#### Vine (make 2 with A and 1 with B):

Ch 31.

Row 1: Slip st in 2nd ch from hook and next 4 chs, [ch 3, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook, slip st in next 5 chs] 5 times. Fasten off.

#### **Hanging Vine:**

With D, ch 32.

**Row 1**: Slip st in 2nd ch from hook and next 4 chs, [ch 3, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook, slip st in next 5 chs] 5 times, working on opposite side of ch, [slip st in next 5 chs, ch 3, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook], slip st in each remaining ch across, ch 12. Leaving long end, fasten off.

#### **Assembly:**

Fold ch 12 in half. Using long end, sew to first slip st of Hanging Vine to create hanging loop. Sew Hanging Vine around top of Wreath as shown in photo.

#### **Small Leaf:**

With D, ch 5.

**Row 1**: Slip st in 2nd ch from hook and each remaining ch across, [ch 5, sc in 2nd ch from hook, hdc in next ch, dc in next ch, (hdc, slip st) in next slip st next ch] twice. Fasten off.

#### Wreath Assembly:

Using glue gun, attach Leaves and Vines to Wreath as shown in photo or as desired.
