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Single Skein Beanie Lion Brand Design Team

All you need is one skein of Lion Brand Country yarn to work up this Single Skein Beanie crochet pattern. In no time at all, you'll have a stylish, cozy beanie in the

Crochet Hook: N/15 or 10 mm hook

Yarn Weught: (6) Super Bulky/Super Chunky (4-11 stitches for

4 inches)

Materials:

• Lion Brand Country: Nantucket

• Lion Brand Crochet Hook - Size N-13 (9 mm)

• Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6)

Size: One Size

Finished Circumference: About 19 in. (48.5 cm), will stretch to fit a range of sizes.

Finished Height: About 8 in. (20 cm)

Gauge:

 $11 \frac{1}{2}$ sts = about 4 in. (10 cm) over pattern.

Stitch Explanation:

sc2tog (sc 2 sts together) (Insert hook in next st and draw up a loop) twice, yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook – 1 st decreased.

Notes:

Hat

is worked in joined rnds beg at lower edge, with RS always facing.

Hat:

Ch 53. Taking care not to twist ch, join with sl st in first ch to form a ring.

Rnd 1 (RS): Ch 4 (counts as dc and ch 1), *sk next ch, dc in next ch, ch 1; rep from * around; join with sl st in 3rd ch of beg ch-4 – 27 dc and 27 ch-sps.

Rnd 2: Ch 4 (counts as dc and ch 1), sk first ch-sp, *dc in next ch1-sp, ch 1; rep from * around; join with sl st in 3rd ch of beg ch-4.

Rnds 3-7: Rep Rnd 2.

Shape Crown (top of Hat)

Rnd 8: Ch 1, *2 sc in each ch 1- sp; rep from * around; join with sl st in first sc – 54 sts at the end of this rnd.

Rnd 9 (Dec): Ch 1, *sc in each of next 7 sc, sc2tog; rep from * around; join with sl st in first sc -



48 sts.

Rnd 10 (Dec): Ch 1, *sc in each of next 6 sc, sc2tog; rep from * around; join with sl st in first sc – 42 sts.

Rnd 11 (Dec): Ch 1, *sc in each of next 5 sc, sc2tog; rep from * around; join with sl st in first sc – 36 sts.

Rnd 12 (Dec): Ch 1, *sc in each of next 4 sc, sc2tog; rep from * around; join with sl st in first sc – 30 sts.

Rnd 13 (Dec): Ch 1, *sc in each of next 3 sc, sc2tog; rep from * around; join with sl st in first sc – 24 sts.

Rnd 14 (Dec): Ch 1, *sc in each of next 2 sc, sc2tog; rep from * around; join with sl st in first sc – 18 sts.

Rnd 15 (Dec): Ch 1, *sc in next sc, sc2tog; rep from * around; join with sl st in first sc – 12 sts.

Rnd 16 (Dec): Ch 1, *sc2tog; rep from * around; join with sl st in first sc – 6 sts.

Cut yarn, leaving a long yarn tail. Thread yarn tail through sts of last rnd and pull to gather. Knot securely.

Finishing:

Weave in ends.

How To Crochet A Simple Center Piece Michael Sellick from The Crochet Crowd

Learn how to crochet a simple center piece for the holidays. Only one skein of yarn is used for this free crochet pattern. To accompany this pattern there are two fabulous videos.



Materials:

- Bernat Softee Chunky 1 Skein
- Size J Hook, or 6.0 mm

Instructions:

- 1. Create Slip Knot and Chain 4. Slip hook through the starting chain, then slip stitch to form a ring.
- 2. Chain 3, then Double Crochet 11 Times around the ring. Slip stitch the final to the top of the chain 3.
- 3. Chain 3, then Put 1 Double Crochet where you began the chain up, then place 2 Double Crochet into each stitch around the circle. Slip Stitch at the end. This will double your size.
- 4. Chain 3, then Put 1 Double Crochet into the next stitch, then *put 2 Double Crochet into the next stitch, then place 1 Double Crochet into the next stitch and repeat from * all the way around, slip stitch at the end. In the tutorial Mikey says this is the 1 2 Ratio.
- 5. Chain 3, then Put 1 Double crochet into the next 2 stitches, then put 2 Double Crochet into the next stitch, then place 1 Double Crochet into the next 2 stitches, repeat from * all the way around. Slip stitch at the end. In tutorials this is the 2 2 Ratio.
- 6. Chain 3, Mikey demonstrates going behind the stitches on the 3rd string. It creates an obvious pattern line. See video if confused by this. *Put 1 Double Crochet into the next 3 strings behind the stitches, then put 2 Double Crochet into the next string repeat from *. Slip stitch at the end, Mikey refers to this as the 3 2 Ratio.
- 7. Chain 3, Create a ruffle. Place 3 Double Crochet into each stitch on the circle. Place the stitches as normal. Slip stitch at the end.
- 8. Chain 1, then *chain 3, place 1 Single Crochet into the very next stitch and repeat from *. This makes the edges look random and no so uniform. Slip stitch at the end.
- 9. Cast off using a weaving technique.

One Skein Wrap Marilyn Losee for Caron Yarn

Use an easy crochet pattern like this one to make a beautiful wrap. It's great because you can use just one skein of yarn to make it from start to finish.

Crochet Hook: N/15 or 10 mm hook

Yarn Weight: (4) Medium Weight/Worsted Weight and

Aran (16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

Materials:

- Caron International One Pound (100% acrylic; 16 oz/454 g, 812 yds/742 m skein): One skein, Shown in: #589 Cream
- One size US N-15 (10mm) crochet hook, or size to obtain gauge.
- Yarn needle

Size: Wrap measures approximately 24"/61cm wide x 68"/172.5cm long

Gauge: In pattern, 3 pattern repeats = 16"/40.5cm and 7 rows = 8"/20.5cm. Note: One pattern repeat forms one "wave", and includes one dc7tog, 6 tr, and the ch-1 sps between them.

Stitches Used: Chain (ch), double crochet (dc), single crochet (sc), treble crochet (tr)

Special Terms:

dc2tog: Double crochet 2 together—[Yarn over, insert hook in next stitch and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook] 2 times, yarn over and draw through 3 loops on hook.

dc3tog: Double crochet 3 together—[Yarn over, insert hook in next stitch and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook] 3 times, yarn over and draw through 4 loops on hook.

dc4tog: Double crochet 4 together—[Yarn over, insert hook in next stitch and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook] 4 times, yarn over and draw through 5 loops on hook.

dc7tog: Double crochet 7 together—[Yarn over, insert hook in next stitch and draw up a loop,



yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook] 7 times, yarn over and draw through 8 loops on hook.

Notes:

- 1. Wrap is worked horizontally (lengthwise).
- 2. For a longer or shorter wrap, work more or fewer beginning chains in multiples of 12. Each multiple of 12 will lengthen or shorten the wrap by about 2"/5cm.
- 3. For a wider or narrower wrap, work more or fewer repeats of Rows 2 and 3.

Wrap:

Ch 159 loosely.

Row 1: Dc3tog working over 4th ch from hook and next 2 ch, ch 1, [tr in next ch, ch 1] twice, (tr, ch 1, tr) in next ch, [ch 1, tr in next ch] twice, ch 1, *dc7tog over next 7 ch, ch 1, [tr in next ch, ch 1] twice, (tr, ch 1, tr) in next ch, [ch 1, tr in next ch] twice, ch 1; repeat from * to last 4 ch, dc4tog over last 4 ch, turn—13 pattern repeats.

Row 2: Ch 3, dc in next ch-1 sp, [dc in next tr, dc in next ch-1 sp] 5 times, dc in next tr, *dc2tog over next 2 ch-1 sps (skipping the dc7tog in between), dc in next tr, dc in next ch-1 sp] 5 times, dc in next tr; repeat from * across to last ch-1 sp, dc2tog over last ch-1 sp and last dc3tog, turn. **Row 3:** Ch 3, sk first dc2tog, dc3tog over next 3 dc, ch 1, [tr in next dc, ch 1] twice, (tr, ch 1, tr) in next dc, [ch 1, tr in next dc] twice, ch 1, *dc7tog over next 7 dc, ch 1, [tr in next dc, ch 1] twice, (tr, ch 1, tr) in next dc, [ch 1, tr in next dc] twice, ch 1; repeat from * to last 4 dc, dc4tog over last 4 dc, turn.

Repeat Rows 2 and 3 until piece measures 24"/61cm wide (or to desired width). Fasten off.

Finishing:

Fringe

- 1. Cut remaining yarn into strands 14–16"/35.5–40.5cm long.
- 2. Holding 2 strands together, fold fringe in half. *Insert crochet hook from WS to RS in side edge of wrap, pull fold through, insert ends into fold and pull tight against edge; repeat from *, working across side edge. Repeat across other side edge.

Optional (knotted fringe): Draw one end of the 2 strands all the way through the piece, folding the strands in half, until all 4 ends are even, tie an overhand knot about 1"/2cm from side edge.

Cute Bunny Deb Richev for Caron Yarn

This easy crochet pattern only calls for one skein of yarn, it's that easy. Crochet a bunny for the Easter holiday or for a child's toy.

Crochet Hook: G/6 or 4 mm hook

Yarn Weight: (4) Medium Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran (16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

Gauge: Gauge is not critical for this project. Work tightly to ensure that the stuffing will not show through the stitches.

Materials:

- Caron International One Pound (100% acrylic; 16 oz/454 g, 812 yds/742 m skein):
- One skein
- Shown in: #508 Sky Blue
- One size US G-6 (4mm) crochet hook, or size to obtain gauge.
- Stitch marker
- Two safety eyes—18mm diameter (or buttons)
- Polyester fiberfill
- Scraps of pink yarn (for nose) and brown yarn (for mouth)
- Yarn needle

Gauge: Gauge is not critical for this project. Work tightly to ensure that the stuffing will not show through the stitches.

Stitches Used:

Chain (ch), double crochet (dc), half double crochet (hdc), single crochet (sc)

SPECIAL TERMS:

sc2tog: Single crochet 2 together—[Insert hook in next st, yo and pull up a lp] twice, yo and draw through all 3 lps on hook.

hdc2tog: Half double crochet 2 together—[Yo, insert hook in next st and pull up a lp] twice, yo and draw through 5 lps on hook.



Ip st: Loop stitch—Wrap yarn around index finger twice and hold behind work, insert hook into indicated st and between the yarn wrap and your finger, pull all lps through st, yo and draw through all lps. Note: Loops form on side of fabric that is facing away from you.

Notes:

- 1. Bunny is worked in continuous rounds; do not join and do not turn at the ends of rounds. Place a stitch marker to indicate the beginning of rounds and move marker as each round is worked.
- 2. Stuff body, head, arms, and legs as work progresses. Do not stuff ears or tail.
- 3. When fastening off, always leave a 12-18"/30.5-45.5cm long tail for sewing.
- 4. If desired, weight the bottom with a small nylon bag of beans or poly-pellets. Place the bag at the bottom of the body before beginning to stuff with fiberfill.
- 5. A yarn pompom may be used for the bunny's tail, instead of the crochet tail.

BODY

Rnd 1: Ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook—6 sc.

Rnd 2: 2 sc in each st around—12 sts.

Rnd 3: [Sc in next st, 2 sc in next st] 6 times—18 sts.

Rnd 4: [2 sc in next st, sc in next 2 sts] 6 times—24 sts.

Rnds 5–10: Continue as established, increasing 6 sc evenly spaced in every rnd—60 sts.

Rnd 11: Sc in each st around.

Rnd 12: [Sc in next 9 sts, 2 sc in next st]—66 sts.

Rnds 13–18: Sc in each st around.

Rnd 19: [Sc in next 9 sts, sc2tog] 6 times—60 sts.

Rnds 20–23: Sc in each st around.

Rnds 24: [Sc in next 4 sts, sc2tog, sc in next 4 sts] 6 times—54 sts.

Rnds 25–34: Continue as established, decreasing 6 sc evenly spaced in every 5th rnd—42 sts.

Rnds 35: Sc in each st around.

Rnd 36: [Sc in next 5 sts, sc2tog] 6 times—36 sts.

Rnds 37–40: Continue as established, decreasing 6 sc evenly spaced in every other rnd—24 sts.

Rnds 41 and 42: Sc in each st around. Fasten off.

HEAD

Rnds 1–6: Work Rnds 1–6 of body—36 sts.

Rnds 7 and 8: Sc in each st around.

Rnd 9: Sc in next 17 sts, 2 sc in next 2 sts, sc in next 17 sts—38 sts.

Rnd 10: Sc in next 14 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 8 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 14 sts—40 sts.

Rnd 11: Sc in next 19 sts, 2 sc in next 2 sts, sc in next 19 sts—42 sts.

Rnd 12: Sc in next 18 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 4 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 18 sts—44 sts.

Rnd 13: [Sc in next 10 sts, 2 sc in next st] 4 times—48 sts.

Rnds 14-24: Sc in each st around.

Attach safety eyes in Rnd 11, 3 sts before and 3 sts following the 2 sc increases.

Rnd 25: [Sc in next 3 sts, sc2tog, sc in next 3 sts] 6 times—42 sts.

Rnd 26: [Sc in next 5 sts, sc2tog] 6 times—36 sts.

Rnds 27–31: Continue as established, decreasing 6 sc evenly spaced in every rnd—6 sts. Fasten off. Thread tail through stitches of last round, pull tight, and secure.

ARM (make 2)

Rnds 1-4: Work Rnds 1-4 of body-24 sts.

Rnd 5: Sc in each st around.

Rnd 6: [Sc in next 7 sts, 2 sc in next st] 3 times—27 sts.

Rnds 7-11: Sc in each st around.

Rnd 12: [Sc in next 7 sts, sc2tog] 3 times—24 sts.

Rnd 13: [Sc in next 3 sts, sc2tog, sc in next 3 sts] 3 times—21 sts.

Rnds 14 and 15: Continue as established, decreasing 3 sc evenly spaced in every rnd—15 sts.

Rnds 16-39: Sc in each st around. Fasten off.

LEG (make 2)

Rnds 1–4: Work Rnds 1–4 of body—24 sts.

Rnd 5: [Sc in next 7 sts, 2 sc in next st] 3 times—27 sts.

Rnds 6-12: Sc in each st around.

Row 13 (heel begins): Hdc in next 8 sts, turn; leave remaining sts unworked—8 sts.

Row 14: Ch 1, sc in next 9 sts, turn; leave remaining sts unworked—9 sts.

Row 15: Ch 1, sc in first st, hdc in each st to last st, sc in last st, hdc2tog over side edge of row and next unworked st of Rnd 12, turn—10 sts.

Row 16: Ch 1, sc in each st across, hdc2tog over side edge of row and next unworked st of Rnd 12, turn—11 sts.

Rows 17 and 18: Repeat Rows 15 and 16—13 sts.

Rnd 19 (heel ends): Ch 1, sc in first st, hdc in each st to last st, sc in last st, hdc2tog over side edge of row and next unworked st of Rnd 12; continue working across sts of Rnd12 as follows, sc2tog, sc in next 8 sts, sc2tog, sc2tog over last st and side edge of beginning of rnd, do not turn—25 sts.

Rnd 20: Sc in next 2 sts, hdc in next 9 sts, sc in next 14 sts.

Rnd 21: Sc in next 3 sts, hdc in next 7 sts, sc in next 15 sts.

Rnd 22: [Sc in next 3 sts, sc2tog] 5 times—20 sts.

Rnds 23-66: Sc in each st around. Fasten off.

EAR (make 2)

Rnds 1 and 2: Work Rnds 1 and 2 of body—12 sts.

Rnd 3: Sc in each st around.

Rnd 4: [Sc in next st, 2 sc in next st] 6 times—18 sts.

Rnds 5–8: Continue as established, increasing 6 sc evenly spaced in every other rnd—30 sts.

Rnds 9–22: Sc in each st around.

Rnd 23: [Sc in next 4 sts, sc2tog, sc in next 4 sts] 3 times—27 sts.

Rnds 24–27: Sc in each st around.

Rnd 28: [Sc in next 7 sts, sc2tog] 3 times—24 sts.

Rnds 29–43: Continue as established, decreasing 3 sc evenly spaced in every 5th rnd—15 sts.

Rnds 44-52: Sc in each st around. Fasten off.

TAIL

Rnd 1: Ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook—6 sc.

Rnd 2: Lp st in each st around.

Rnd 3: 2 lp st in each st around—12 sts.

Rnd 4: [Lp st in next st, 2 lp st in next st] 6 times—18 sts. Fasten off.

FINISHING

Sew head to top of body. Sew ears to top of head. Sew arms to sides of body. Sew legs to bottom of body along Rnd 11. Sew tail to back of body. Using photograph as a guide, with pink yarn embroider nose, and with brown yarn, embroider mouth. Using yarn needle, weave in all ends.

Pretty Princess Tiara April Garwood for Red Heart Yarn

Let your child's dream of being a princess come true with this free crochet pattern. Your littles ones will love using this piece while playing dress up.

Crochet Hook: H/8 or 5 mm hook

Yarn Weight: (4) Medium Weight/Worsted Weight and

Aran (16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

Materials:

- RED HEART® Super Saver®: 1 skein 324 Bright Yellow
- Susan Bates® Crochet Hook: 5mm [US H-8]
- Stitch-lock markers
- Pink ¼"[0.6 cm] diameter craft beads
- 3" [8 cm] length of 5/8" [1.6 cm] sew-on Velcro®
- Sewing thread to match yarn
- Sewing needle
- Yarn needle

Gauge: 13 sts = 4'' [10 cm]; 18 rows = $4\frac{1}{4}''$ [11 cm] in sc. CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size hook to obtain the gauge.

Size: Crown measures 4" [10 cm] high and will fit up to 20" [50 cm] circumference.

Special Abbreviations

sc2tog = draw up a loop in next 2 sts, yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook. Bead-picot = ch 1, slide bead up to hook, ch 1, enclosing bead, ch 1, insert hook under front loop and vertical bar of last sc, pull yarn through all loops.

Crown:

Ch 72.

Row 1 (Wrong Side): Sc in 2nd ch and each ch across; turn – 71 sc.

Rows 2 and 3: Ch 1, sc in each sc across; turn.

Row 4: Slip st in 26 sc, ch 1, sc2tog in same and next sc, sc in next 18 sc, sc2tog; turn leaving remaining sts unworked – 20 sc.

Rows 5-12: Ch 1, sc2tog over first 2 sc, sc across to last 2 sc, sc2tog over last 2 sc; turn – 4 sc at end of Row 12.

Row 13: Ch 1, [sc2tog over next 2 sc] twice; turn – 2 sc.

Row 14: Ch 1, sc2tog – 1 sc. Fasten off.



Edging:

Place marker in tip of point; starting at marker, place a marker every 1½" [4 cm] along both sides of triangle and along top of band. String beads onto yarn with yarn needle. Row 1: With right side facing, join yarn with slip st to first slip st of Row 4, ch 1, * sc evenly to next marker, sc in marked st, bead-picot **; repeat from * to point of triangle, (2 sc, beadpicot, sc) all in point; repeat from * to end of band, end at **; sc to end of band. Fasten off.

Finishing:

Weave in ends. Using sew-on Velcro strips, sewing needle, and thread to match yarn, stitch a 3" [8 cm] strip of Velcro to each end of band, facing each other, to close back of crown.

Abbreviations: ch = chain; mm = millimeters; sc = single crochet; st(s) = stitch (es); * or ** = repeat whatever follows the * or ** as indicated.

Lacy Pineapple Scarf Tammy Hildebrand for Red Heart Yarn

With this free Red Heart pattern, you can make a Lacy Pineapple Scarf for yourself or a friend. It's an easy crochet pattern you'll adore any time of the year.

Crochet Hook: J/10 or 6 mm hook

Yarn Weight: (5) Bulky/Chunky (12-15 stitches for 4

inches)

Materials:

• RED HEART® Boutique™ "Changes™": 1 ball 9902 Ruby

Crochet Hook: 6mm [US J-10]

Yarn needle

Size:

Scarf measures 6" wide x 56" long

Gauge:

Gauge is unimportant for this project and varies depending on which section of yarn is in use.

Special Stitches

beg shell (beginning shell) = ch 3, (dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in same space or st.

shell = (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) all in the same space or st.

joining beg shell = ch 3, dc in same space, ch 1, drop loop from hook, insert hook in corresponding ch-2 space on last row of First Half, pick up dropped loop and pull through, ch 1, 2 dc in same space on Second Half.

joining shell = 2 dc in same space, ch 1, drop loop from hook, insert hook in corresponding ch-2 space on last row of First Half, pick up dropped loop and pull through, ch 1, 2 dc in same space on Second Half.

Note: Scarf is made in two halves and joined in the middle

Scarf:

First Half

Row 1 (Right Side): Ch 14; sc in 2nd ch from hook and each ch across; turn – 13 sc.

Row 2: Beg shell in first sc, [ch 3, skip next 5 sc, shell in next sc] twice; turn – 3 shells.

Rows 3 and 4: Ch 1, skip first dc, slip st in next dc and into ch-2 space, beg shell in same space, [ch 3, shell in ch-2 space of next shell] twice; turn.

Row 5: Ch 1, skip first dc, slip st in next dc and into ch-2 space, beg shell in same space, ch 3, 6



dc in ch-2 space of next shell, ch 3, shell in ch-2 space of last shell; turn.

Row 6: Ch 1, skip first dc, slip st in next dc and into ch-2 space, beg shell in same space, ch 3, dc in next dc, [ch 1, dc in next dc] 5 times, ch 3, shell in ch-2 space of last shell; turn.

Row 7: Ch 1, skip first dc, slip st in next dc and into ch-2 space, beg shell in same space, ch 3, [sc in next dc, ch 3] 6 times, shell in ch-2 space of last shell; turn.

Row 8: Ch 1, skip first dc, slip st in next dc and into ch-2 space, beg shell in same space, ch 3, skip next ch-3 space, [sc in next ch-3 space, ch 3] 5 times, shell in ch-2 space of last shell; turn.

Row 9: Ch 1, skip first dc, slip st in next dc and into ch-2 space, beg shell in same space, ch 3, skip next ch-3 space, [sc in next ch-3 space, ch 3] 4 times, shell in ch-2 space of last shell; turn.

Row 10: Ch 1, skip first dc, slip st in next dc and into ch-2 space, beg shell in same space, ch 3, skip next ch-3 space, [sc in next ch-3 space, ch 3] 3 times, shell in ch-2 space of last shell; turn.

Row 11: Ch 1, skip first dc, slip st in next dc and into ch-2 space, beg shell in same space, ch 3, skip next ch-3 space, [sc in next ch-3 space, ch 3] twice, shell in ch-2 space of last shell; turn.

Row 12: Ch 1, skip first dc, slip st in next dc and into ch-2 space, beg shell in same space, ch 3, skip next ch-3 space, shell in next ch-3 space, ch-3, shell in ch-2 space of last shell; turn.

Rows 13-32: Repeat Rows 3-12 twice more.

Rows 33 and 34: Repeat Rows 3 and 4 once more.

Fasten off.

Second Half:

Rows 1-33: Work same as Rows 1-33 of First Half.

Joining Row 34: Ch 1, skip first dc, slip st in next dc and into ch-2 space, joining beg shell in same space, [ch 3, joining shell in next shell] twice. Fasten off. Weave in ends.

Abbreviations:

beg = beginning; ch = chain; dc = double crochet; mm = millimeters; sc = single crochet; st(s) = stitch (es); yo = yarn over; [] = work directions in brackets the number of times specified.

Pop Star Slouch Hat Leisure Arts

Work up this easy crochet slouchy hat pattern using just one skein of worsted weight yarn in any color. Three different sizes are available to choose from (small, medium, and large). Make this stylish hat for yourself or for your fashionista friend.

Crochet Hook: I/9 or 5.5 mm hook

Yarn Weight: (4) Medium Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran (16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

Materials:

- Yarn (Medium Weight): [5 ounces, 256 yards (141 grams, 234 meters) per skein]: 1 skein
- Crochet Hook: Size I (5.5 mm) or size needed for gauge
- Yarn needle

Size:

Size: Small {Medium-Large}

Fits Head Circumference: 19{21-23}"/48.5{53.5-58.5} cm

Gauge:

Body (Cluster, ch 1) 8 times and 7 rnds = 4'' (10 cm)

Band 7 ridges (14 rows) = 4" (10 cm)

Gauge Swatch 3½" (9 cm) diameter

Work same as body through Rnd 2: 16 Clusters and 16 ch-2 sps.

Stitch Guide:

BEGINNING CLUSTER (uses one sp)

Ch 3, * YO, insert hook in sp indicated, YO and pull up a loop, YO and draw through 2 loops on hook; repeat from * once more, YO and draw through all 3 loops on hook.

CLUSTER (uses one sp)

* YO, insert hook in sp indicated, YO and pull up a loop, YO and draw through 2 loops on hook; repeat from * 2 times more, YO and draw through all 4 loops on hook.

Instructions:

Body

Ch 6; join with slip st to form a ring.

Rnd 1 (Right side): Work Beginning Cluster in ring, ch 3, (work Cluster in ring, ch 3) 7 times; join with slip st to top of Beginning Cluster: 8 Clusters and 8 ch-3 sps.



Note: Loop a short piece of yarn around any stitch to mark Rnd 1 as right side.

Rnd 2: Slip st in first ch-3 sp, work (Beginning Cluster, ch 2, Cluster, ch 2) in same sp, (work Cluster, ch 2) twice in next ch-3 sp and in each ch3 sp around; join with slip st to top of Beginning Cluster: 16 Clusters and 16 ch-2 sps.

Rnd 3: Slip st in first ch-2 sp, work (Beginning Cluster, ch 1, Cluster, ch 1) in same sp, (work Cluster, ch 1) twice in each of next 2 ch-2 sps, work Cluster in next ch-2 sp, ch 1, * (work Cluster, ch 1) twice in each of next 3 ch-2 sps, work Cluster in next ch-2 sp, ch 1; repeat from * around; join with slip st to top of Beginning Cluster: 28 Clusters and 28 ch-1 sps.

Rnd 4: Slip st in first ch-1 sp, work Beginning Cluster in same sp, ch 1, (work Cluster in next ch-1 sp, ch 1) twice, (work Cluster, ch 1) twice in next ch-1 sp, * (work Cluster in next ch-1 sp, ch 1) 3 times, (work Cluster, ch 1) twice in next ch-1 sp; repeat from * around; join with slip st to top of Beginning Cluster: 35 Clusters and 35 ch-1 sps.

Rnd 5: Slip st in first ch-1 sp, work Beginning Cluster in same sp, ch 1, (work Cluster in next ch-1 sp, ch 1) 5 times, (work Cluster, ch 1) twice in next ch-1 sp, * (work Cluster in next ch-1 sp, ch 1) 6 times, (work Cluster, ch 1) twice in next ch-1 sp; repeat from * around; join with slip st to top of Beginning Cluster: 40 Clusters and 40 ch-1 sps.

Size Small ONLY

Rnd 6: Slip st in first ch-1 sp, work Beginning Cluster in same sp, ch 1, (work Cluster in next ch-1 sp, ch 1) 8 times, (work Cluster, ch 1) twice in next ch-1 sp, * (work Cluster in next ch-1 sp, ch 1) 14 times, (work Cluster, ch 1) twice in next ch-1 sp; repeat from * once more; join with slip st to top of Beginning Cluster: 43 Clusters and 43 ch-1 sps.

Size Medium ONLY

Rnd 6: Slip st in first ch-1 sp, work Beginning Cluster in same sp, ch 1, (work Cluster in next ch-1 sp, ch 1) 6 times, (work Cluster, ch 1) twice in next ch-1 sp, * (work Cluster in next ch-1 sp, ch 1) 7 times, (work Cluster, ch 1) twice in next ch-1 sp; repeat from * around; join with slip st to top of Beginning Cluster: 45 Clusters and 45 ch-1 sps.

Size Large ONLY

Rnd 6: Slip st in first ch-1 sp, work Beginning Cluster in same sp, ch 1, (work Cluster in next ch-1 sp, ch 1) twice, (work Cluster, ch 1) twice in next ch-1 sp, * (work Cluster in next ch-1 sp, ch 1) 5 times, (work Cluster, ch 1) twice in next ch-1 sp; repeat from * around; join with slip st to top of Beginning Cluster: 47 Clusters and 47 ch-1 sps.

All Sizes

Rnd 7: Slip st in first ch-1 sp, work Beginning Cluster in same sp, ch 1, (work Cluster in next ch-1 sp, ch 1) around; join with slip st to top of Beginning Cluster.

Repeat Rnd 7 until Body measures approximately 7½{88½}"/ 19{20.521.5} cm from beginning ring.

Next Rnd: Slip st in first ch-1 sp, ch 1, sc in same sp, (2 sc in next ch-1 sp, sc in next ch-1 sp) around; join with slip st to first sc: 64{6770} sc.

Last Rnd: Ch 1, sc in same st as joining and in each sc around; join with slip st to first sc, finish off.

Band:

Ch 10.

Row 1 (Right side): Sc in second ch from hook and in each ch across: 9 sc.

Note: Mark Row 1 as right side.

Row 2: Turn; sc in Back Loop Only of each sc across (Fig. 1, page 45).

Repeat Row 2 for pattern until Band measures approximately 19{2123}"/48.5{53.5-58.5} cm when slightly stretched, ending by working a wrong side row.

Finishing:

Finish off, leaving a long end for sewing.

Thread yarn needle with long end.

Whipstitch last row of Band to beginning ch, then whipstitch Band to Last Rnd of Body using same end.



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
